My Connection in Grief

The Mission of Peter's Place is to provide safe and supportive environments for grieving children and families, and to foster understanding of the effects of death and grief. This past summer, I was personally impacted by our mission. My Mom died at the end of June after a long battle with dementia. Losing a parent is never easy, but when you no longer have parents here on Earth, there are many emotions that come with it.

In August, my oldest nephew got married — it was an amazing time with friends and family — it was also when I was able to start processing my mom's death. Life is about connections. My parents were our last lifeline and connection to our family culture, our heritage, our traditions, and our memories. When they died, I had to mourn the loss of those connections too.

The responsibility to carry those forward for my children is big and heavy, but I realized that I don't have to bear that burden alone. My mom's family from California was at the wedding and I watched them connecting with my kids, sharing stories, speaking Tagalog, laughing, and joking around. It was a connection I didn't know I needed; it was a connection my kids needed.

It was sad that my parents weren't there to see their first grandchild get married, but in a way, I know they were there. They were present through family, through friends, through storytelling, through new memories, and through new connections.

What I have learned through Peter's Place is that grief is something you never get over. Some days are better than others. You work through it one minute, one hour, one day at a time. Look for your support, your connection — it's there for you when you need it most.

Forming Connections Through Loss

Maya and her mom, Wendy, joined our Onsite Programming in 2021 when their dad/husband died from Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease, a rare neurological disorder. At the time of his death, all Wendy wanted to do was help and make sure her daughter was okay, as her dad was her biggest supporter. From her role as a teacher, Wendy had learned about the services Peter's Place offered through referring former students who had experienced a loss.

Peter's Place provides Maya and Wendy with a safe and inviting space where they can get the support they need by meeting with other children, teens, and adults who have also experienced the death of an important person.

"I choose to participate in Peter's Place groups because it has really helped me see other kids' experiences and share my own," Maya said. "The bonds I have made here with other people are just really hard to find, especially in school. Being in a group full of other teens is really helpful."

Wendy has learned to allow Maya to grieve in her own way and not push her to share her feelings when she doesn't want to. She loves seeing the familiar faces every time she steps into Peter's Place. Wendy feels it's nice knowing that all the participants are here for each other and whatever they share in the group is ok.

"Maya wants to come. She wants to be part of a group, and she wants to connect and hear other people's stories. She is also seeing that the wound, the hole, of pain inside of her has also become the place where she is allowing friendship and warmth. She's allowing people to see that hole that many other people in our lives don't see," said Wendy. "Similar to myself, ironically, it's the pain that forces me to come back to the reality of the loss but it's not a feeling of sadness anymore, it's the feeling of healing now, and I think that's what Peter's Place has done. The loss will never go away; it's just a part of who we are now."

Peter's Place continues to be a trusted source of grief support in the community, ensuring no child ever grieves alone.


